A LOOK AT THE FALL OF 2021

AN UPDATE ON ATLANTIC CANADA

The final months of 2021 at Prison Fellowship Canada (PFC) were busy, and we witnessed firsthand the Lord's hand and favour in PFC's Angel Tree program. Two hundred sixty-seven kids received gifts from their incarcerated parents. Here is a message back from one of our sponsors delivering a gift "We had a great opportunity to meet with the families; the program equally touched the children and caregivers, and they were appreciative of the gifts and handwritten note from their parent." Praise God that we could include fourteen children in the program this year in PEI.

We have been working closely with Nova Institution for Women on our Bridgecare program. Since early Fall, we have seen five clients enter the program to be matched with PFC volunteers in the community. We are enjoying working alongside in-prison and community chaplaincy to advance the Bridgecare program. We have also been building our PFC support base with volunteers, churches, partner organizations and transitional houses through Nova Scotia and New Brunswick primarily as we journey with the Bridgecare clients from institution to halfway houses to homes. Most recently, we have added a Newfoundland focus to our volunteer recruitment.

PFC's PF By Phone program which provides spiritual care and prayer to inmates has been active in all New Brunswick's provincial jails and one Nova Scotia Jail. We currently have eighteen volunteers in the Atlantic region as part of the overall team of volunteers who serve on the phone lines, some of whom are bilingual volunteers who help support bilingual calls coming into the line from all Canadian provinces.

We are pleased to announce that we have brought onto the team a full-time Regional Manager, Cynthia d'Entremont, to represent PFC

in the Maritime provinces. She will be the point of contact for our volunteers in this region, and her contact information is below.

Lori Knappe will be stepping away from her position as the Atlantic Administrator. We are sad to see her go and have greatly valued her contribution and support to the PFC ministry. She will be missed, and we will keep her close! We look forward to future opportunities to work together.

If you or anyone you know would like to learn more about prison ministry, please contact Cynthia, or visit our website for information. PFC provides step-by-step instructions on getting started, a comprehensive training program, and resources to minister to prisoners. Most recently, we have added a Newfoundland focus to our volunteer recruitment. If you are interested in getting involved or know of someone who would like to be involved in any Atlantic province, we would love to have you on our Atlantic Canada PFC volunteer team. Our next training session is in February 2022.

Maintaining the connection between an incarcerated parent and their children will continue to impact the pathway of change for many families and for years to come. One family knows this firsthand, with sibling Angel Tree children first benefitting from the program for many years and now paying it forward as sponsors in the program for other families. Notable highlights included the exponential growth of the sponsor base in Saskatchewan and Quebec, more parents participating in PEI, and the rest of the country maintaining its strong performance. In 2021, we saw a three percent overall increase from 2020.

A MESSAGE OF THANKS

During the most challenging seasons, we often strongly see God's sovereignty. While 2021 began with a hope that the global and domestic upheaval would subside and that in-prison ministry would resume, soon, it was clear that things were not going to be as hoped.

Yet we see many examples of God's blessings in Scripture when circumstances seem bleak for those who trust in Him. At times we may be discouraged, but God's sovereignty will fulfill His promises for us, and His name will be glorified. This year was an example of God's providence in a challenging year. Through your partnership, we completed 2021 with all our commitments to the programs met.

Some celebrations from this Fall include the commission of the Gospel of John curriculum, ***Walking the Good Path***. This curriculum is sensitive in nature towards the First Nation community. This is particularly tremendous because research has shown that the Indigenous population is significantly overrepresented in Canadian prisons and jails. Current statistics show as high as forty percent of our institutional system is Indigenous. Indigenous women now represent fifty percent of the female prison population in Canada. Many

are keen to know and follow Jesus. May God continue to work through this curriculum and the hearts of all Indigenous Canadians in our care.

December finished strong, with 3,424 children served through the Angel Tree Christmas program. Praise God for all the work He has done. Praise God for allowing us to begin the process of Federal Prison clearance for our volunteers. This clearance will enable volunteers to serve on PF By Phone and in-prison for the next ten years. This clearance prepares volunteers for in-prison ministry as soon as institutions are open again.

While the past few months may have been challenging for us all, we praise God for His providence and grace. We also thank you for your faithful partnership and prayers throughout the year. May you experience God's love and blessings this year and always.
