We pray for wisdom and direction as we review our organizational structure and examine the best ways to serve our mission and vision. We pray that we would have hearts attentive to the Spirit's leading and for the boldness to press forward with the divine solutions He inspires.

25 1Life with Chaplains

We thank the Lord for this wonderful opportunity to play our 1Life game with Ontario Chaplains. We pray that the deeply meaningful concepts that abound from the experience would highlight the problem in a greater light and encourage everyone towards more intentional problem-solving and solutions.

26 Research & Development

As we continue to develop internal processes to streamline our work and develop better solutions for self-care, time management, and organizational growth, we pray for wisdom, guidance, restoration in the ways we don't easily recognize that we might need, and for humility with the process.

27 In-Prison Returns

We continue to thank the Lord for the progress we see towards in-prison volunteers returning to serving in an in-prison setting. We continue to ask the Lord to open more doors across the country for a swift and expedient return. We also pray for open doors to facilitate our revised and rebranded curriculum.
