Angel Tree Christmas

We pray that the present from an incarcerated parent would create a beautiful memory during a time that would otherwise be difficult. May the Lord redeem this bad situation through the kindness of sponsors.

15 Fiscal Year End

We pray that PFC's financial objectives for the 2022-23 fiscal year will be met in abundance, along with God's grace and His foreknowledge in preparation for the things to come. We pray that we would continually be people who are faithful in pursuit of the mission You've given to us.

16 Heart of Worship

We pray for the volunteers attending tonight's PFC Orientation. May the call of Jesus and the mission to prisoners be stirred within their hearts and may each one find a meaningful place to serve.

20 Chaplain Care

We lift up our partners in serving prisoners, the local institutional chaplains, in prayer, and ask the Lord to provide rest for the wearied souls, joy for the heavy laden, and peace to the downcast or distraught. May these precious souls find encouragement in their work and meaning in all of it.

21 Perceptions of Prisoners

We pray that the stigmas surrounding the prisoner population would be powerfully broken, and many believers would begin to see themselves and Jesus in the plight of the prisoner. We pray that many would be moved to get involved in selfless abandon and trust in God's redeeming grace.

22 Faith & Justice

We pray that the true biblical definitions of faith and justice would be restored among the prisoner population. We pray that prisoners would turn to Jesus and find resolve in His wisdom and timing for all things.

23 Walking in Step

We lift up our national staff and ask the Lord to give us a unified vision for the work we do, so that we might be knit together closely in our labours, giving no place for the enemy to create division or destruction. We pray that each member will continue to hear clearly from the Lord and be swift to act when they do.

24 Released Giftings

We pray that the Holy Spirit would ignite a fire for each staff member, volunteer, supporter, and partner, to walk more confidently into their area of gifting. We pray that the body would continue see signs and wonders in heaven and earth accompanying our faith, leading many to know Him.

25 Bridgecare Volunteer Teams

We continue to pray for partnered Bridgecare volunteers in every major city in the GTA (greater Toronto area) to serve returning citizens wherever they might return to. We also pray for volunteer teams in Windsor, Sarnia, Sault Ste Marie, London, Barrie, Kitchener, & Thunder Bay.





We pray for wisdom for our PFC by Phone volunteers to speak the truth with gentleness and respect. We pray that the love of Jesus will be deeply felt to prepare the hearts of callers for the truth of Jesus.

27 Prison Lockdowns Cease!

We pray that every issue that arises leading to prison lockdowns would be stopped in the name of Jesus! We pray that solutions will abound, and this ongoing cycle of prison lockdowns would cease.

28 The Word of a Friend

We pray that every volunteer and supporter in our database would be challenged to tell a friend about the ministry of Prison Fellowship Canada. We pray that every ministry need we have would be met through the word of a faithful friend.

29 Spiritual Formation

We pray that every seed that has been planted in the life of a prisoner through Bible studies, Bridgecare Mentorship, or PFC by Phone line support, would be protected as it grows up into an oak tree of faith. We ask the Lord to bring His Word that gives life to mind and strengthen the will of prisoners to yield themselves to it.

30 Church Engagement

We pray that the Spirit of the Lord would go before us and make known the work we do both in and out of prisons to local churches – especially to those that are close to prisons. We pray that more volunteers would be drawn to serving Jesus the prisoner.
